Greater Community AIDS Project Walk, Run, Roll Saturday, October 9

The Greater Community AIDS Project Walk, Run, Roll will occur on October 9 @ Burwash Park in Savoy. GCAP provides emergency HIV/AIDS services and prevention education in East Central Illinois.

The walk, run, roll participants choose from a 1 mile walk, 5K run, or 10 mile bike ride. Prizes will be awarded for the most funds raised and the most participants recruited. Adult prizes include a \$400 ticket package from Krannert Center for the Performing Arts, a 3 month membership from Truly Fit gym, a \$75 gift certificate to Champaign Cycle, and gift certificates from Cardinal Fitness, Xinh Xinh, and Le Peep.

Children's prizes include a party package from Jupiter's at The Crossing, a \$75 gift certificate to Champaign Cycle, a \$90 bike helmet from Durst Cycle, and a combo costume/candy package from Dallas & Co. and World Harvest.

Minimum donation for adults is \$20, children 6 to 18 is \$10. Children under 6 participate free.

Additional Notes from Sept 19 PCC Board meeting

Lorrie Pearson analyzed the CUAP riders. Of the 99 riders in the sample (106 actually rode) resgistered day of ride, 63 registered on line (29 of these from CU). Of the 24 of the 198 persons on the PCC membership list participated, 15 registering on line, 9 on day of ride. Fifty non PCC members from CU participated.

Local bicycle advocacy groups are discussing getting a local certified bicycle safety trainer and how to fund such person's certification as a trainer
